Essays

Ideally, by the time students sit down to write their college essays, they have already written and revised several practice essays. Writing a compelling personal narrative utilizes many skills learned in high school. Requiring students to write short practice essays about their life experiences, opinions on current affairs, ambitions for the future, or positions on political issues helps take the anxiety out of essay writing. It also allows educators to build a college-going culture by giving all students the chance to practice, revise, and read examples of each other's "college entrance" work.
