Advise TX is building momentum for Texas' college-going culture



A statewide effort to lead low-income and first-generation students to college is gaining momentum, thanks to a program that sends near-peer college advisers to high school campuses.

The Advise TX College Advising Corps has placed highly trained advisers in 120 Texas high schools this fall, to guide students through the complex college and financial aid application process and to help them find the best postsecondary college fit.

The effort, in its third year, is showing impressive results, said Jennifer Pandya, Statewide Coordinator for Advise TX. In 2011-2012, the most recent year for which there are results, some 33,000 high school seniors applied to one or more colleges through the ApplyTexas web site, after receiving assistance from Advise TX advisers.
